

Undergraduate Certificate in Gender and Health

This undergraduate certificate will provide students with a robust understanding of the interdisciplinary scholarship and teaching on gender and health. This certificate will foster knowledge about historical, social, and physiological factors related to health and its connections to gender, sexuality, race, ethnicity, and class. The 15 hours of coursework will expand students' knowledge of gender and health, and enable them to engage with diverse populations as they enter fields such as healthcare, law, and counseling.
